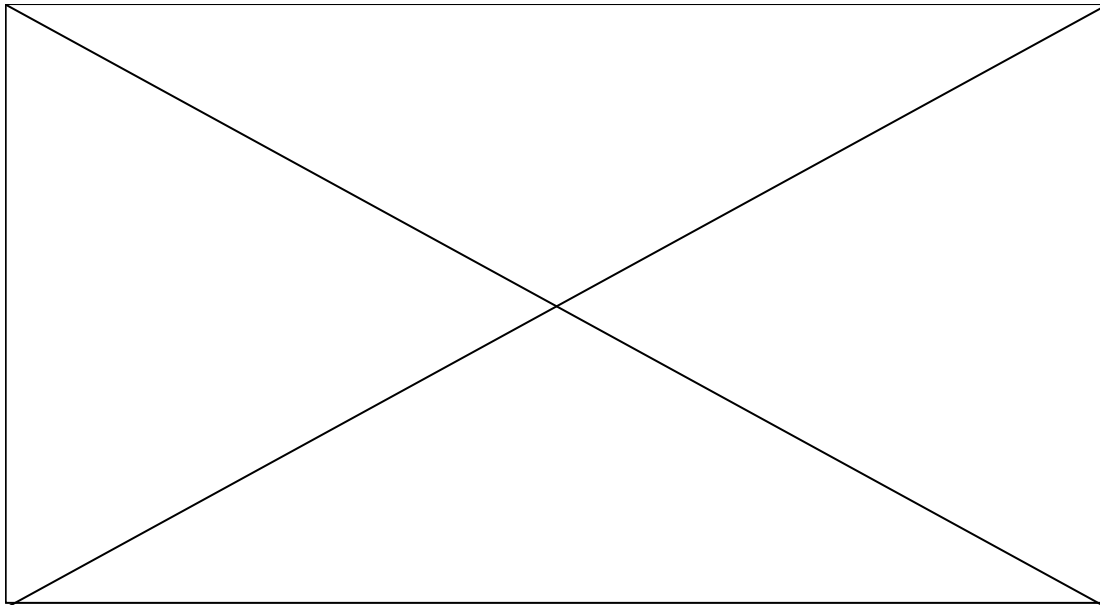


Graph: Coffee Production

The graph shows the ten biggest coffee producers in 2003. According to the graph, it was clear that the majority of coffee producers gathers in America and Brazil was the biggest one in this region with 1.708 million kilograms. This number was as double as the amount of coffee in Columbia which is the neighbor of Brazil with 705 million kilograms. Follow were Mexico accounts for 273 million kilograms, Guatemala account for 180 million kilograms and the last was Honduras with 175 million kilograms. The amount of coffee produced in these three countries was not different a lot.

Asia was the second ranked region in producing the coffee in 2003. On the top was Vietnam with 675 million kilograms.
